Investigating the sovereign-subject relationship through the discursive analysis of who fights and does not fight for their state

This research main's impact will be through the understanding of warfare literature. It challenges several commonly-held assumptions about different socio-technological military inventions in the field of international security studies (conscription, the loyalty of the citizen towards the state, the public-private differentiation of the use of force). Through the use of discourse analysis and by investigating the monumental architecture of war, it investigates the empirical cases of foreign fighting, the 'mass citizen army,' and the invented traditions of warfare.
